




FIRST READING

Acts of the Apostles 2: 1-11

The apostles were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different languages.

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven staying in Jerusalem. At this sound, they gathered in a large crowd, but they were confused because each one heard them speaking in his own language. 
- Bless the LORD, O my soul! O LORD, my God, you are great indeed! How manifold are your works, O LORD! The earth is full of your creatures.

- 3. May the glory of the LORD endure forever; may the LORD be glad in his works! Pleasing to him be my theme; I will be glad in the LORD.


In one Spirit we were all baptised making one body.

No one can say, "Jesus is Lord," except by the Holy Spirit.

HOLY GOSPEL John 13: 1-15

I confess one baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.





will be sung by the Compline Choir of Saint Joseph Cathedral Sunday, June 4, at 9:00 p.m.

The Office is prayed by candlelight and lasts about 40 minutes. It consists of psalms, short passages from scripture, an office hymn, a canticle (*Nunc Dimittis*), a responsory, collect, and additional prayers.

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
